# Larry Cozine Family Camp DURING Medicine Mountain Summer Camp

## RESERVATIONS

To secure your reservation, you will be required to pay for your first nights stay. This is a non-refundable deposit. The balance will be due 1 week prior to your arrival. Please contact the Scout office to make your reservations (605) 342-2824.

You will need to provide the following information for a reservation:

- Dates you plan to arrive
- Date you plan to depart
- Tent Camping or RV Hookup
- Names of people camping at family camp
- Number and type of Meal Requests (if applicable/see below)
- Form of Payment: We accept checks and VISA, MC, AMX and Discover credit cards.
- Contact information/Primary Contact in camping group

You will be required to contact the Camp Ranger after 4:00PM to announce your arrival and obtain a camping decal. Due to the large numbers of Scouts checking in between 1:00PM and 4:00PM we ask that you wait until after 4:00PM to check in with the Camp Ranger. The Ranger will have the ability to provide you with a receipt of payment as well as assist you with any payments for meals at your check in. You will not be able to “claim” a site until checking in with the camp ranger. If you are unable to locate the Camp Ranger please contact any Staff Person at Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch and they will locate the Ranger for you.

## CAMPING SITES

RV Sites with Electrical Hook-up (30amp **ONLY**).....\$25/night

- Sites will accommodate RV's up to 25 feet long
- Water is available but no direct hookup
- No sewage dump site or sewer hookup

Tent sites (children 5 and under stay for free).....\$5/per person/per night

## PHYSICAL FACILITIES

- Dinning shelter
- Flush toilets
- Water
- Hot showers

## MEALS (Available during the summer camping season only)

Guests at the Cozine Family Camp can purchase meals from the commissary at Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch. If you would like to eat with a unit that is staying at Medicine Mountain, please let the commissary know in advance so that your food can be included with the Troops meal.

Supper.....\$8/ person

## **TRADING POST**

At the Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch Trading Post we strive to provide a wide and varied selection of both Scout related items as well as general camping and memorabilia to commemorate your trip to Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch. Below are some items you can expect to find:

- Camping Items: knives, compass, personal items, fishing gear, and phone cards
- Handicraft Items: woodcarving supplies, basketry, leatherwork kits, and Indian lore items
- Medicine Mountain Souvenirs
- Clothing items: T-shirts, sweatshirts, hats, belts and patches
- Food Items: soda, ice cream, candy, water, sports drinks, slushies, snacks and ice

## **MEDICAL SERVICES**

Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch provides a well-stocked Health Office staffed by a licensed Medical Officer to handle minor medical needs. More serious cases will be referred to Custer Regional Hospital/Clinic, which is less than 30 minutes from our property.

## **COMMUNICATING WITH THE OUTSIDE WORLD**

While camping can be a vacation from the cares of the world, limited cell phone and internet access is available, as well as, mail service for those desiring to maintain a connection with the world. Typically cell plans that operate on Verizon or Alltel have the best success with service. Wireless access is also available with limited connectivity for adults at Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch across the road.

## **CAMPSITE CAMPFIRES:**

Fire danger varies from year to year; therefore, you may or may not be allowed to have your own campsite campfire. Restrictions are according to U.S. Forest Service recommendations.

## **CAMPFIRE PROGRAMS:**

Friday evening's campfire is open to the entire camp and we encourage all units/patrols to share a skit, song, etc. Remember, all skits, songs, run-ons and jokes should be in good taste and must be pre-approved by the camp's Program Director/Commissioners. Avoid themes that make fun of minorities or body functions. Those in family camp are welcome!

## **CHAPEL SERVICES:**

A short program of uplifting thoughts and songs is provided Monday evening for all interested participants. We encourage all to attend. The "Honor Trail" will follow directly after the services.



## CAMPGROUND RULES

All campers are asked for their cooperation in helping the Scout Ranch maintain these high standards of moral and personal behavior. The following specific rules have been established for the health and safety of all campers:

- No hazing, initiations, or harassment is allowed.
- No smoking is allowed on camp property except in the main parking lot.
- Fire danger is ever-present. At the discretion of the Camp Ranger, campfires and open flames may be banned.
- Alcoholic beverages are not permitted.
- Illegal drugs are not permitted and will be reported to law enforcement.
- Theft will be reported to local law enforcement.
- Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch/Larry Cozine Family Campground will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
- Visitors must check-in and out with the Camp Ranger or Camp Office.
- No flames in tents!
- No trenching around tents.
- No firearms or ammunition may be brought to camp.
- No archery equipment may be brought to camp.
- Fireworks of ALL types are prohibited.
- Pets, all though not recommended, are allowed but must be contained, kept quiet and cleaned-up after. NOTE: Pets are not allowed in any other area of Medicine Mountain Scout Ranch except the Larry Cozine Family Campground.
- No chain saws.
- No cutting of trees. If it is on the ground, use it. If it is standing, leave it. This means that no standing trees, alive or dead, are to be cut, pushed down, or affected in any way. Anything lying on the ground is open for your use.
- Stripped bark or hacking a tree will result in a fine, starting at \$5.00 per inch and up to the market value of the tree.
- Speed limit 5 MPH
- No riders in back of trucks or on a trailer.
- Conflicts between campers will be resolved by Camp Management or law enforcement.

## REFUND POLICY

- The first night campsite reservation deposit is non-refundable
- No refunds will be issued unless it is due to medical or family emergency. If medical emergency, documentation from a medical professional will be required
- No shows or participants leaving camp for non-emergency reasons will have no fee's refunded.
- All refund requests are due in writing to the Black Hills Area Council Office no later than 1 week after the last day of the family camp reservation.
- Camp Personnel can not authorize refunds
